THE MISSION OF THE TWELVE (Matthew 9:35-10:8) The Holy Gospel for the fourth Sunday after Pentecost combines two sections from Saint Matthew: (a) Jesus' revelation of the proper relation of being "sent out" with the Gospel and being a disciple of Jesus the Great Shepherd; and (b) a narrative on the "inner circle" of the Twelve disciples and their specific call during Jesus' ministry before his suffering and death.

The Twelve are not merely "sent" by Jesus – they are sent as his chosen representatives, Jesus' ambassadors with authority to act on the Messiah's behalf. The Lord of the Church calls the Twelve to announce the advent of salvation "in *His* stead and by *His* command". And so it is today when the pastor stands before God's people and announces "Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the ✠ Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen".

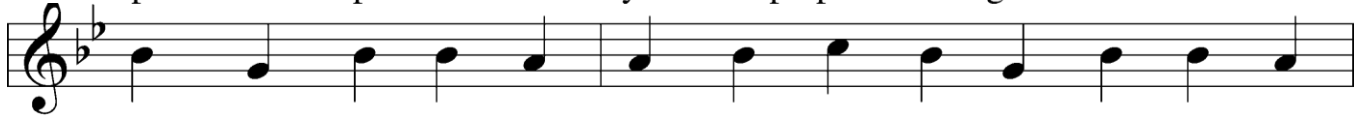

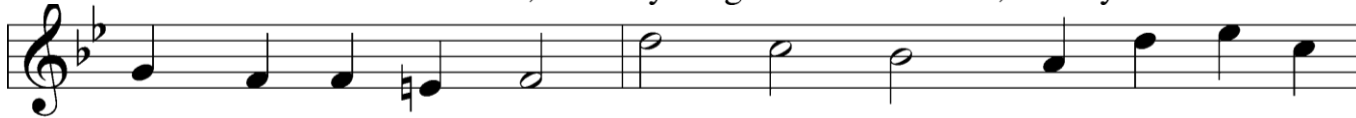

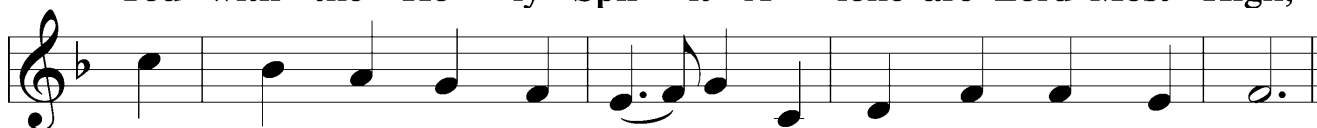

Exodus 19:2-8

The Lord calls Moses to the mountain to speak to him and deliver His covenant to Israel.

[The people of Israel] set out from Rephidim and came into the wilderness of Sinai, and they encamped in the wilderness. There Israel encamped before the mountain, while Moses went up to God. The LORD called to him out of the mountain, saying, “Thus you shall say to the house of Jacob, and tell the people of Israel: You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles’ wings and brought you to myself. Epistle (page 942 in the pew Bibles)

Romans 5:6-15

St. Paul proclaims that in Adam, all die, and in Christ all are made alive again.

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life. More than that, we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned— for sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law. Yet death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sinning was not like the transgression of Adam, who was a type of the one who was to come.

But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if many died through one man’s trespass, much more have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for many.

Matthew 9:35 – 10:8

Jesus continues God's plan of salvation revealed in Genesis, commissioning His 12 disciples to be workers in the "fields ripe for harvest" and bringing the healing Gospel to the lost sheep of Israel.

Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

And he called to him his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to heal every disease and every affliction. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother; James the son of Zebedee, and John his brother; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them, "Go nowhere among the Gentiles and enter no town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And proclaim as you go, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, cast out demons. You received without paying; give without pay."
