### PRAYER UPON ENTERING

Most Gracious Heavenly Father, you have announced that your Son is surely coming. Forgive my indifference to your Word, and help me trust in my Savior. Make me ready for his arrival that I may pray with all other believers, "Come Lord Jesus." In his saving name I pray. Amen

WATCH! THE DAY AND HOUR OF THE COMING (Mark 13:32-37) The coming of our Lord is the theme of the entire season of Advent; his coming at Bethlehem, his coming at Jerusalem, his coming through Word and Sacrament, and his coming at the Last Day. This first week of a new Church Year continues the note sounded last Sunday—the Sunday of the Fulfillment—the theme of the unexpected coming of the Lord, "for us and for our salvation." As Augustine says:

The first coming of Christ the Lord, God's son and our God, was in obscurity. The second will be in sight of the whole world. When he came in obscurity, no one recognized him but his own servants. When he comes openly, he will be known by both the good and the bad. When he came in obscurity, it was to be judged. When he comes openly, it will be to judge. He was silent at his trial, as the prophet foretold. ... Silent when accused, he will not be silent as judge. Even now he does not keep silent, if there is anyone to listen. But it says he will not keep silent then, because his voice will be acknowledged even by those who despise it.

Commenting on this sobering Advent season passage, Kretzmann writes:

With so much information given them, the disciples might have thought that they ought to know the exact date of Christ's second advent, for that would greatly simplify matters. But Christ rejects the idea before it has been voiced. Of the day when the final judgment will burst upon the world and of the hour of the day when its first indications will come to pass, no person knows; even the angels are ignorant, though they know many of the secrets and mysteries of God. And what is more, the day is not known to Jesus in his state of humiliation. The Son of God, in his capacity as Savior of men and specifically according to his human nature, has renounced his right to this knowledge, chiefly for the sake of men, lest they be tempted to make inquiries and bother him with importunate pleadings concerning the day and the hour. Here is a secret which is hidden in the omniscience of the Father. But that fact brings out Christ's admonition all the more strongly: Be on the lookout, be vigilant, for the exact time is not known upon earth.

All the calculations of the various sects as to the exact date of Christ's coming are utterly unreliable vagaries, and those that follow them are just as foolish. ...

Thus Jesus, the Lord of his Church, has given to each one of his believers, his servants, some work to do, some ability, some gifts, with which the individual Christian is to serve him in his kingdom. The Lord will return some time, soon, almost any minute, and therefore it is necessary for every one of the servants to be about his business with careful vigilance. The Master may come in any of the four watches of the night, and His coming must find no one sleeping in security.

Let every Christian write upon the portals of his heart that one word: Watch! It is very true, indeed, that the unbelievers think it a huge joke to ridicule the belief of the Christians about the coming of Judgment Day: Where is the promise of his coming? For since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of creation, 2 Peter 3:3-7. It is absolutely safe to stand on God's Word and to heed His warning at all times: Watch!"



Isaiah 64:1-9

Oh that you would rend the heavens and come down, that the mountains might quake at your presence—as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil—to make your name known to your adversaries, and that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome things that we did not look for, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.





#### WORDS OF OUR LORD

(Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25)

Pastor: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My + body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this altar in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor of this congregation. For further study, see *Matthew 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34.* 

#### What actually is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) should be received, after proper instruction and preparation, in the sure and certain confidence that Jesus Christ is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine to forgive the sin of all who receive him in repentance (according to 1Corinthians 10:14-17; 11: 17-33; Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-30). Please review the questions on pages 326-27 and 329-330 in the front part of "Lutheran Service Book" for a proper understanding of this holy meal.

## Who may properly come to the Lord's Supper?

You are invited to receive Christ's true body and blood if you:

- have been Baptized into the name of the Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit);
- repent of your sin against God and recognize your need to forgive others as God has forgiven you; put your trust in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation;
- are old enough to examine your own faith and life (according to 1Corinthians 11:27-32);
- believe in the words of Jesus himself when he declares that his Body and Blood are truly present in, with and under the bread and wine, offering life, salvation and the forgiveness of sins;
- sincerely intend to live a God-pleasing life in accordance with God's will as revealed in the Bible;
- have received instruction about the Supper at a Lutheran Church Missouri Synod congregation.

I now come to the Lord's Table having read, understood and agreed with these beliefs.

a bond of closer union with You and Your people,



## DECEMBER HYMN OF THE MONTH

ON JORDAN'S BANK THE BAPTIST'S CRY LSB 344 Advent is often misunderstood as a time of preparation for Christmas only, but the season also gives us a chance to reflect on Christ's second coming. The hymn begins with John the Baptizer. The first two stanzas convey his message of preparation and repentance, which was foretold by the prophet Isaiah: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God" (Isaiah 40:3). His words ring true for the Church today as it awaits Christ's second coming, when He will return to judge the living and the dead.

Without Christ, we wither and fade like grass (Isaiah 40:7-8), but in Him "our refuge and our great reward," we are safe and secure (stanza 3). God promised the same to Abram in Genesis 15:1: "Fear not Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great." This promise was confirmed continually by the Lord through His prophets, and in these last days by His Son (Hebrews 1:2), without whose "grace we waste away."

Stanza 4 echoes the psalmist David, "Stretch out Your hand from on high; rescue me and deliver me" (Psalm 144:7). The Old Testament is filled with prayers such as this and with promises of blessing and healing. These prayers and promises are fulfilled in no greater way than in Jesus Christ, for it is in Him that the world sees the glory of God, the light that shines out of darkness (2 Corinthians 4:6). When Christ first came to earth, He healed the sick, forgave sins, and raised the dead. But when He comes again, all sickness will be destroyed, sin will be no more, and all who believe in Christ will be raised never to die again.

The final stanza is a doxology to the Holy Trinity centering on freedom in Christ. The people in the Old Testament lived with the hope that they would be freed through the coming messiah, and this hope is fulfilled in Christ. Jesus says Himself, "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36). It is in and through Christ that believers will receive the ultimate freedom on the Last Day, when all the dead will be raised and sin wiped away. It is then that the angels and archangels and all the company of heaven will gather in the ultimate hymn of praise to the Holy Trinity.

## What is the Advent wreath?

The Advent wreath is the circle of candles (and/or evergreen branches) that you see in the sanctuary during the season of Advent. Some Advent wreaths hang

from the ceiling of the sanctuary while others are placed on a floor stand. Either way, the Advent wreath is one of the many beautiful things you'll see around the church during Advent.



#### How do we use the advent wreath?

It used to be that the Advent wreath was used in the home to help count the four weeks of Advent. Now you can find them in homes as well as in the church sanctuary. Each Sunday in Advent, a new candle on the wreath is lit. For example, during the first week in Advent, only one candle is lit. During the second week in Advent, two candles are lit. We do this to remember and prepare for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ, the Light of the World!



**Parents:** Before or after the Divine Service, allow your children to walk up to get a better look at the Advent wreath. Remind them to be reverent in God's holy places. During this Advent season, try utilizing an Advent wreath at home with family devotions. If you are unsure how to get started, ask your pastor for help.
