Here Isaiah 43:1-4 is fulfilled. The Father speaks and the Holy Spirit descends in the form of a dove. With His baptism, Jesus begins His public ministry of proclaiming the Word of God and establishing the sacraments as He secures the redemption of a world bent on its own destruction.






Romans 6:1-11

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Holy Gospel (page 836 in the pew Bibles)

Mark 1:4-11

John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist and ate locusts and wild honey. And he preached, saying, "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens opening and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Pastor: This is the Gospel of Our Lord.

Cong: Praise to You, O Christ.

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.







WORDS OF OUR LORD

(Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25)

Pastor: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My + body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

PAX DOMINI

(John 20:19)

Pastor: The peace of the Lord be with you always.

Cong.: Amen.



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this altar in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor of this congregation. For further study, see Matthew 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34.

What actually is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) should be received, after proper instruction and preparation, in the sure and certain confidence that Jesus Christ is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine to forgive the sin of all who receive him in repentance (according to 1Corinthians 10:14-17; 11: 17-33; Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-30). Please review the questions on pages 326-27 and 329-330 in the front part of "Lutheran Service Book" for a proper understanding of this holy meal.

Who may properly come to the Lord's Supper?


Wild may property come to the Lord's Supper:
You are invited to receive Christ's true body and blood if you:
have been Baptized into the name of the Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit);
repent of your sin against God and recognize your need to forgive others as God has forgiven you
put your trust in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation;
are old enough to examine your own faith and life (according to 1Corinthians 11:27-32);
believe in the words of Jesus himself when he declares that his Body and Blood are truly present
in, with and under the bread and wine, offering life, salvation and the forgiveness of sins;
sincerely intend to live a God-pleasing life in accordance with God's will as revealed in the Bible;
have received instruction about the Supper at a Lutheran Church Missouri Synod congregation.
I now come to the Lord's Table having read, understood and agreed with these beliefs.

PRAYER BEFORE COMMUNING

Almighty Lord Jesus Christ, as often as I shall come to Your holy table to refresh my spirit, I pray You to make me, unworthy as I am, worthy through Your grace; impure as I am, to make me clean; naked as I am, to clothe me, so that Your body, so full of divine power, and Your most precious blood may not become for me, Your servant, the occasion for judgment or punishment, but a memorial of the death You underwent for me, a strengthening of my faith, a proof of the taking away of my sins, a bond of closer union with You and Your people, an increase of holiness, the basis of a glad resurrection, and a pledge of everlasting life. Amen.







JANUARY HYMN OF THE MONTH

WITHIN THE FATHER'S HOUSE - LSB 410 Within the Father's House" is expressly suited to the Epiphany reading of the visit by the boy Jesus to the temple (Luke 2:46-47). The hymn' author, James Russell Woodford (1820-85), makes it clear that the mystery of the incarnate God escapes even the most learned until God should manifest Himself in Christ.

The same is true for the unlearned.

From beginning to doxology, the hymn confesses the sublime mystery. "The mighty truth" of stanza 3 and "the secret of the Lord" of stanza 4 refer to the inscrutable wonder that is God Himself: "Father, Son, and Holy Ghost" (stanza 6).

Doctors of the law, notwithstanding their scholarship or wisdom, can only marvel at the child Jesus. He is incomprehensible because He is God. The keenest human eye fails to see God hidden in the human flesh of Jesus. Humanity is helpless before the most vital question, "Who is God?"

The boy conversing with the teachers in God's house is the one true Son. In a reversal of what we expect of adolescents, Jesus does not seek autonomy. His home is with His Father. The Son's own manifestation of His Divine person and work begins with His expressed self-knowledge captured in the hymn's opening lines, "Within the Father's house the Son has found His home." Jesus knows Himself to be the Father's Son. Unity with His Father is definitive and indissoluble. Hence, Jesus asks what should be evident, "Did you not know that I must be in My Father's house?" (Luke 2:49).

"The secret of the Lord" (stanza 4) is disclosed in the "incarnate God" (stanza 3). To know the man Jesus is to know God. He is one and the same. Christ reveals Himself through His teaching, of which Jesus' "gracious words" (stanza 2) in the temple are a token. The first "dim revealing" stanza 5) is a cause for awe, as with the first shafts of morning light. To be visited by the Lord of life is like meeting the morning. It is not the watching or the waiting that cause the sun to rise, for it comes of itself. But in its sudden revelation is the promise of full daylight. In the same way, "the full epiphany" in stanza 4 is the appearance of Christ is unconcealed glory, which "faithful pondering hearts await. "Until then, Christ, though hidden by "the earthly veil" (stanza3), still opens to each believer, whether cultured or common, the anticipation of knowing fully the mighty truth of God, the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.
