THE CATCH OF FISH & THE CALL OF PETER (Luke 5:1-11) This morning we hear how Jesus establishes his church on earth. (Matthew 4:18-22; Mark 1:16-20; Luke 5:1-11) The structure of this passage focuses not on the miraculous catch of fish, but upon the catch of fish as it points to the greater miracle, the call of a mere fisherman named Peter to be Christ's witness in the world. The setting for this event is one of instruction. Jesus is conducting a "Catechism Class" as he teaches and the future disciples hear the Word of God. Martin Luther's comments are helpful here: "The preaching of Jesus comes first; everything else that happens in the passage is the result of His Word. This preaching takes place in a setting of water and boats and nets. The technical vocabulary of fishing is scattered throughout this pericope, suggesting that the hearer take seriously the image of fishing as a metaphor for the work of Jesus and His disciples." This morning we hear that the boat is a place where Jesus comes and instructs and saves and calls. We are reminded of the ark which God provided to save His people. Dr. Arthur Just, in his commentary on Luke writes: "Because Christ is present in the boat, it becomes a symbol of the Church, where Christ's teaching and miracles take place and where believers are gathered." Again, Luther: "It is our comfort, however, that Christ, through our preaching, will lead His own into the boat." Have no fear..., nor be troubled, but in your hearts reverence Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you. For Christ also died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit; in which He went and preached to the spirits in prison, who formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you. (1 Peter 3:15, 18-21)



Isaiah 6:1-13

In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!"

And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"

Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for."

And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Then I said, "Here am I! Send me."

And he said, "Go, and say to this people: "Keep on hearing, but do not understand; keep on seeing, but do not perceive.' Make the heart of this people dull, and their ears heavy, and blind their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their hearts, and turn and be healed." Then I said, "How long, O Lord?"

And he said: "Until cities lie waste without inhabitant, and houses without people, and the land is a desolate waste, and the Lord removes people far away, and the forsaken places are many in the midst of the land. And though a tenth remain in it, it will be burned again, like a terebinth or an oak, whose stump remains when it is felled." The holy seed is its stump.

Epistle (page 960 in the pew Bibles)

1 Corinthians 14:12-20


So with yourselves, since you are eager for manifestations of the Spirit, strive to excel in building up the church.

Therefore, one who speaks in a tongue should pray for the power to interpret. For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays but my mind is unfruitful. What am I to do? I will pray with my spirit, but I will pray with my mind also; I will sing praise with my spirit, but I will sing with my mind also. Otherwise, if you give thanks with your spirit, how can anyone in the position of an outsider say "Amen" to your thanksgiving when he does not know what you are saying? For you may be giving thanks well enough, but the other person is not being built up. I thank God that I speak in tongues more than all of you. Nevertheless, in church I would rather speak five words with my mind in order to instruct others, than ten thousand words in a tongue.

Brothers, do not be children in your thinking. Be infants in evil, but in your thinking be mature.

Luke 5:1-11

On one occasion, while the crowd was pressing in on [Jesus] to hear the word of God, he was standing by the lake of Gennesaret, and he saw two boats by the lake, but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, which was Simon's, he asked him to put out a little from the land. And he sat down and taught the people from the boat. And when he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch." And Simon answered, "Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets." And when they had done this, they enclosed a large number of fish, and their nets were breaking. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both the boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.





(John 20:19)

Pastor: The peace of the Lord be with you always.

Cong.: Amen.



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this altar in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor of this congregation. For further study, see Matthew 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34.

What actually is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) should be received, after proper instruction and preparation, in the sure and certain confidence that Jesus Christ is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine to forgive the sin of all who receive him in repentance (according to 1Corinthians 10:14-17; 11: 17-33; Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-30). Please review the questions on pages 326-27 and 329-330 in the front part of "Lutheran Service Book" for a proper understanding of this holy meal.

Who may properly come to the Lord's Supper?

You are invited to receive Christ's true body and blood if you:

- ☐ have been Baptized into the name of the Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit);
- repent of your sin against God and recognize your need to forgive others as God has forgiven you;
- put your trust in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation;
- are old enough to examine your own faith and life (according to 1Corinthians 11:27-32);
- believe in the words of Jesus himself when he declares that his Body and Blood are truly present in, with and under the bread and wine, offering life, salvation and the forgiveness of sins;
- incerely intend to live a God-pleasing life in accordance with God's will as revealed in the Bible;
- ☐ have received instruction about the Supper at a Lutheran Church Missouri Synod congregation.

I now come to the Lord's Table having read, understood and agreed with these beliefs.

PRAYER BEFORE COMMUNING

Almighty Lord Jesus Christ, as often as I shall come to Your holy table to refresh my spirit, I pray You to make me, unworthy as I am, worthy through Your grace;

impure as I am, to make me clean; naked as I am, to clothe me,

so that Your body, so full of divine power,

and Your most precious blood may not become for me, Your servant,

the occasion for judgment or punishment,

but a memorial of the death You underwent for me,

a strengthening of my faith, a proof of the taking away of my sins,



FEBRUARY HYMN OF THE MONTH

THE PEOPLE THAT IN DARKNESS SAT - LSB 4l2A This hymn originated as a seven-stanza paraphrase of Isaiah 9 by John Morison (1749-98), published in 1781 in a draft edition of the Scottish *Translations and Paraphrases* as "The race that long in darkness pined." The hymn has continued to undergo many changes over the years. One of the most thorough revisions was completed for *Hymns Ancient and Modern* (1861), where it appeared with a doxological sixth stanza, titled as we know it here.

The text used for this hymn in *LSB* is essentially that used in *Hymns Ancient and Modern*, restoring the pronouns that had been updated in *LW*. The third stanza, referring to the Lord's victory over Midian and included in *TLH*, has been omitted, following *LW*.

Despite its revisions over the years, this hymn still stands as a faithful paraphrase of the comforting words of Isaiah. A valuable and fitting addition to the Epiphany section, the text embodies much of what is celebrated during this season: God has revealed Himself in the person of Christ, and we have been brought into His light.

It puts the words of Isaiah's prophecy into the people's mouths, helping us to realize not only what has been done for us in Christ, but also what we look forward to in His second coming.

Two stanzas included in Morison's original text have been omitted from *LSB* and other modern hymnals. The imagery in these stanzas does not lend itself easily to being sung by families, with their mention of "slaughtered squadrons" and "shrieks of woe," despite being faithful to the text of Isaiah's prophecy (Isaiah 9:4-5). The version we have in *LSB* highlights the prophecies in verses 2 and 6-7 of Isaiah's text.
