






Pastor: This is the Gospel of our Lord. Cong.: Praise to You, O Christ.





Malia Stenzel was born in Landau, Bavaria, on June 29, 1926. She was baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit in Landau, Bavaria.

Malia married Ulrich Stenzel on December 10, 1960. They have 3 children, Annette, Reinhard, and Mark.

Before she immigrated to the United States, Malia had a career as a dental assistant, a profession that she continued to practice until she was married and her children were born; she then became a devoted full-time mom and wife.

She had the gift of hospitality and loved entertaining. She found great joy in having the house full of relatives, friends, and even friends of friends from Germany, Canada, Switzerland, and many other parts of the world.

Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas were faithfully celebrated for over 60 years with the Buddeberg, Gunn, and Sautter families.
