THE SHEPHERD AND THE SHEEP (John 10:22-30) The overarching theme throughout the entire Holy Gospel according to Saint John is the revelation of Jesus as the Messiah and the Son of God. The entire book builds toward this revelation, which is found on the lips of Thomas and reflected by John's explicit explanation of his God-inspired writing: "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:30-31).

It was Saint John Chrysostom, theologian of the early Christian church who wrote that if individuals do not follow Jesus, it is not because He is not the Shepherd, but because they are not his sheep.

Raymond Brown, in his commentary on the Gospel according to John, explains: the flock here stands for Jesus' community – the community of His followers which after His death developed into the primitive Christian community (Acts 20:28-29; 1 Peter 5:3). There is in John an element of predestination as to who shall belong to the flock, but in this, John does not seem to vary from common New Testament teaching. The reference to the sheep in verses 26-27 leads in 28 to the thought of the wolves who snatch the sheep when the hireling guards the flock (John 10:12). However, Jesus is the model Shepherd and no one will snatch from His hand the sheep that the Father has given Him. This is because Jesus acts for the Father, and no one can snatch the sheep from the Father's hand (verse 29). The statement of the Father's supreme power over men in verse 29 recalls Old Testament statements that souls are in God's hands... and that no one can deliver from God's hand (Isaiah 43:13). We note that verses 28 and 29 make the same statement about Jesus and about the Father: no one can snatch the sheep from either's hand. This leads us to an understanding of the unity that is expressed in verse 30: it is a unity of power and operation. It was an affirmation such as found in this verse that ultimately led the 4th century Church to the doctrine of the one divine nature in the Trinity. (Brown 1:407)





READINGS FROM HOLY SCRIPTURE

The First Reading (page 929 in the pew Bibles)

Acts 20:17-35

Now from Miletus [Paul] sent to Ephesus and called the elders of the church to come to him. And when they came to him, he said to them:

"You yourselves know how I lived among you the whole time from the first day that I set foot in Asia, serving the Lord with all humility and with tears and with trials that happened to me through the plots of the Jews; how I did not shrink from declaring to you anything that was profitable, and teaching you in public and from house to house, testifying both to Jews and to Greeks of repentance toward God and of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. And now, behold, I am going to Jerusalem, constrained by the Spirit, not knowing what will happen to me there, except that the Holy Spirit testifies to me in every city that imprisonment and afflictions await me. But I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God. And now, behold, I know that none of you among whom I have gone about proclaiming the kingdom will see my face again. Therefore I testify to you this day that I am innocent of the blood of all of you, for I did not shrink from declaring to you the whole counsel of God. Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood. I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; and from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things, to draw away the disciples after them. Therefore be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish everyone with tears. And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified. I coveted no one's silver or gold or apparel. You yourselves know that these hands ministered to my necessities and to those who were with me. In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive."

Elder: This is the Word of the Lord.

The Second Reading (page 1032 in the pew Bibles)

Revelation 7:9-17

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, saying, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen."

the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat.



of the world to come. Amen.



The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this altar in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor of this congregation. For further study, see Matthew 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34.

What actually is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) should be received, after proper instruction and preparation, in the sure and certain confidence that Jesus Christ is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine to forgive the sin of all who receive him in repentance (according to 1Corinthians 10:14-17; 11: 17-33; Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-30). Please review the questions on pages 326-27 and 329-330 in the front part of "Lutheran Service Book" for a proper understanding of this holy meal.

Who may properly come to the Lord's Supper?

You are invited to receive Christ's true body and blood if you:

- ☐ have been Baptized into the name of the Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit);
- repent of your sin against God and recognize your need to forgive others as God has forgiven you;
- put your trust in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation;
- are old enough to examine your own faith and life (according to 1Corinthians 11:27-32);
- believe in the words of Jesus himself when he declares that his Body and Blood are truly present in, with and under the bread and wine, offering life, salvation and the forgiveness of sins;
- ☐ sincerely intend to live a God-pleasing life in accordance with God's will as revealed in the Bible;
- ☐ have received instruction about the Supper at a Lutheran Church Missouri Synod congregation.

I now come to the Lord's Table having read, understood and agreed with these beliefs.



MAY HYMN OF THE MONTH

WITH HIGH DELIGHT LET US UNITE - LSB 483 This hymn by Georg Vetter (1536-99) was first published in 1566, a year before the author's ordination to the priesthood. The original hymn was thirteen stanzas long. After centuries of disuse, four stanzas of the hymn were brought back in 1932 in Otto Riethmuller's collection *Ein neues Lied*. Condensed to three stanzas in the *Evangelisches Kirchengesangbuch* (1950), it was appointed Hymn of the Day for Jubilate Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Easter, in the German evangelical churches.

Our translation by Martin Franzmann (1907-76) first appeared in the Missouri Synod's *Worship Supplement* of 1969. It is notable for Franzmann's gifted and meticulous preservation of Vetter's original rhyme scheme, in which lines 1 and 2 rhyme, also 4 and 5, 7 and 8, and 9 and 10, while lines 3, 6, and 11 also rhyme with one another, forming the rhyme scheme AA B CC B DD EE B.

The exuberant joy of the resurrection is expressed with dignity and elegance in this great Easter hymn. With the Jerusalem of Isaiah 52, Christians are invited to break forth into singing because Jesus Christ is our salvation. Who are the "pure in heart" invited to take their part? They are those set free from sin and death through faith in the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ meant for every nation and people on earth.

As true God, Christ is the firstborn of the dead, who "by His death has destroyed death, and by His rising to life again has restored to us everlasting life," as the Preface for Easter proclaims. The second stanza reflects the description of the resurrection of the dead in 1 Corinthians 15. God's word gives the promise of victory over death and grave that belongs to us by His grace through faith in the risen Lord Jesus Christ. As His death was "death's undoing," His life is "life renewing" for those who believe (Romans 6:5).

Christ's death and resurrection are ample reason to give Him thanks, praise, and adoration. They motivate the mission of the Church to spread His "honor" in word and deed to every nation. In so doing, we claim the full joy and consolation of freedom from misery and death that belong to God's people in Christ.
