MARY AND MARTHA (Luke 10:38-42) In our Gospel lesson today we meet two different women. We meet Mary and Martha. They are sisters and they both are believers and early followers of Jesus. These two women decide that they want to have Jesus in their home. Jesus accepted their invitation and from there the preparations began. Mary and Martha were having the Son of God as a dinner guest and everything had to be just right. Martha was preparing things at a hectic pace. You can see her working hard, almost beside herself with preparations. Then, suddenly, she realizes that her sister isn't helping her. Mary, instead was sitting. She was sitting at Jesus' feet, listening to every word that poured from his lips. She was hearing the Words of Eternal Life, from the one who is The Life. Nothing could be better! But Martha, did not appreciate this. She thought that Mary should be serving the Lord, not being served by the Lord. Martha was very frustrated. So frustrated that she complained to Jesus about her sister. Jesus answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things, but one thing is necessary. Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from her."

Are you ever like Martha; anxious and troubled about many things? This is not a good feeling. In our busy lives we often feel anxious and troubled about many things. Many things that are not important. As Jesus said, "only one thing is necessary." Only Jesus is necessary. During this week, you are encouraged to re-read the Scripture readings at home and sit at the feet of Jesus, who is the Word of God made flesh. There is room at his feet as you sit with all of the saints that have gone before, including Mary.

JULY HYMN OF THE MONTH

O WORD OF GOD INCARNATE - LSB 523 Called the "poor man's bishop," the "children's bishop," and the "omnibus bishop" (because as the suffragan bishop responsible for the poor district of East London he preferred to travel by omnibus rather than use a bishop's private carriage), Walsham How (1823-97) begins this hymn by proclaiming heaven's finest, Jesus Christ, who chose to dwell among earth's fallen.

In stanza 1, How pictures the incarnate God as Proverb's Wisdom (Proverbs 8-9; 1 Corinthians 1:30; 2:2, 7); as eternal Truth (John 14:6); as the exodus pilgrims' pillar of fire by night (Exodus 13:21-22); and as David's lamp (2 Samuel 22:29). Here How reveals God's great mystery of enfleshing Himself: from eternity, God; in time and to eternity, God-man. God's unveiling of the living, path-illuminating Christ (Psalm 119:105) shines through the ages of Abraham, Issac, Jacob, David, John the Baptist, Luther, and How through our age and into future generations.

The One who becomes flesh to walk among us still goes ahead of us along life's journey, lighting our path on land and guiding our voyage at sea. In stanza 2, the Church receives God's gift, His revealed Word that always points to Jesus, who hushed the wind and calmed the wave.

In stanza 3, we pray that God might make the Church "a lamp of burnished gold." In union with Christ, "the light of the world" (John 8:12), His Church is light in the Lord, the eyes of the hearts of His people enlightened by His Spirit (Ephesians 1:18; 5:8). How's prayer, however, is that the Church might be a burnished, or polished, lamp, so that its holiness might be seen by all. God uses poverty and disease, trial and testing, to fashion His Church to be a lamp of burnished gold. God shines through His Church into the nations. But the Church's suffering will one day end, and we shall see Jesus face to face (Revelation 22:4-5).
