PREPARATIONS FOR THE GREAT BANQUET (Luke 14:1-14) In the first section of chapter 14, Luke prepares the hearer for the next – and more important – section of Luke 14:15-24. With Jesus, mercy does not take a holiday on the Sabbath. It is pride and arrogance that has no place on the Sabbath, or any other day on which God gathers us to enjoy the Bread of forgiveness and new life. This morning, God gathers us again to prepare and offer the greatest of foods – his Word of mercy and comfort, both through the Scriptures and his Holy Meal. Dr. Arthur Just summarizes this passage when he writes:

Luke's concern for the disenfranchised has already been traced throughout the gospel. Included among the outcasts of society are *the Gentiles*, for in the eyes of the Pharisees, Gentiles were the personification of the outcast and sinner. This parable, told in the presence of the Pharisees, deals the final blow to any expectations they had about the table fellowship of Jesus embracing their particular religious perspective. It confirms for them that Jesus is guilty of blasphemy and deserving of death, a view expressed by them in Luke 15:1-2. This parable reiterates that Jesus' fellowship is *with sinners*, *i.e.*, *it is an inclusive event*.

But the parable itself goes beyond simply expressing this tension between those excluded and those included at the banquet. There is also the tension between the present and future reality of the Messianic Feast. This eschatological Feast is both a future event and one already realized in the ministry of Jesus. The table fellowship of Jesus is where Jesus teaches about the kingdom and is itself an expression of the new era of salvation. Jesus' table fellowship with sinners in the course of His ministry as described in Luke's gospel prepares for the full expression of this fellowship at the Last Supper with His disciples where in the meal itself He will give His flesh and blood.







Proverbs 25:2-10

It is the glory of God to conceal things, but the glory of kings is to search things out. As the heavens for height, and the earth for depth, so the heart of kings is unsearchable. Take away the dross from the silver, and the smith has material for a vessel; take away the wicked from the presence of the king, and his throne will be established in righteousness. Do not put yourself forward in the king's presence or stand in the place of the great, for it is better to be told, "Come up here," than to be put lower in the presence of a noble. What your eyes have seen do not hastily bring into court, for what will you do in the end, when your neighbor puts you to shame? Argue your case with your neighbor himself, and do not reveal another's secret, lest he who hears you bring shame upon you, and your ill repute have no end.

Hebrews 13:1-17


Let brotherly love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares. Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them, and those who are mistreated, since you also are in the body. Let marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled, for God will judge the sexually immoral and adulterous. Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." So we can confidently say, "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear; what can man do to me?"

Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings, for it is good for the heart to be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited those devoted to them. We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the holy places by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through his own blood. Therefore let us go to him outside the camp and bear the reproach he endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city that is to come. Through him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge his name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you.

Holy Gospel (page 873 in the pew Bibles)

Luke 14:1-14

One Sabbath, when [Jesus] went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully. And behold, there was a man before him who had dropsy. And Jesus responded to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath, or not?" But they remained silent. Then he took him and healed him and sent him away. And he said to them, "Which of you, having a son or an ox that has fallen into a well on a Sabbath day, will not immediately pull him out?" And they could not reply to these things.

Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honor, saying to them, "When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honor, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, 'Give your place to this person,' and then you will begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher.' Then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

He said also to the man who had invited him, "When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. You will be repaid at the resurrection of the just."







The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this altar in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor of this congregation. For further study, see Matthew 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34.

What actually is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) should be received, after proper instruction and preparation, in the sure and certain confidence that Jesus Christ is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine to forgive the sin of all who receive him in repentance (according to 1Corinthians 10:14-17; 11: 17-33; Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-30). Please review the questions on pages 326-27 and 329-330 in the front part of "Lutheran Service Book" for a proper understanding of this holy meal.

Who may properly come to the Lord's Supper?

You are invited	to receive	Christ's true	body and	blood if you:
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- have been Baptized into the name of the Triune God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit);
- repent of your sin against God and recognize your need to forgive others as God has forgiven you;
 - uput your trust in Jesus Christ alone for your salvation;
- are old enough to examine your own faith and life (according to 1Corinthians 11:27-32);
- believe in the words of Jesus himself when he declares that his Body and Blood are truly present in, with and under the bread and wine, offering life, salvation and the forgiveness of sins;
- incerely intend to live a God-pleasing life in accordance with God's will as revealed in the Bible;
- ☐ have received instruction about the Supper at a Lutheran Church Missouri Synod congregation.

I now come to the Lord's Table having read, understood and agreed with these beliefs.





AUGUST HYMN OF THE MONTH

SON OF GOD, ETERNAL SAVIOR - LSB 842 Somerset Thomas Correy Lowry (1855-1932) wrote this socially minded hymn in 1893 while serving as vicar of North Holmwood in Surrey.

This hymn has been variously placed in the "Service" or "Unity" sections of hymnals, and in earlier sources it appears under "Societies," a category that included labor unions.

Each of the four stanzas alternates praise and supplication, making reference to Christ's eternal attributes and earthly ministry and praying that we live our lives according to His example. Stanzas 1 addresses our "eternal Savior," who existed before the foundation of the world (1Peter 1:20-23) and who has manifested Himself to become the Word made flesh of John 1:14. He is the Son of God, our intercessor and advocate, who "for [His] own will ever plead" (see Hebrews 7:25).

In the second stanza, we are reminded that Jesus, who "lived for others," commanded His disciples, "Love one another: just as I have loved you, you are also are to love one another" (John 13:34). We are "but stewards" of God's bounty, sharing all things that we freely receive in trust: gold, silver, the wealth of land and sea. Stanza 3 bids Christ's peaceable kingdom come among us, a kingdom in which discords will cease, our "fevered thirst of pleasure" will be quenched, and our selfish greed stemmed. Stanza 4 returns our attention to the "Son of God, eternal Savior," strongly evoking His High Priestly Prayer from John 17:22 ("that they may be one even as We are one").






