Heavenly Father, to whom belongs the wisdom of the ages, guide us to decisions that comfort us, but more than any other, guide us to Yourself, lest having great comfort here we forfeit the glory to come; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who with You and the Holy Spirit are one God, now and forever. Amen.

THE PARABLE OF THE RICH MAN AND LAZARUS (Luke 16:19-31) When the Jesuit priest Francis Xavier landed in Japan at Kagoshima in 1549 and began to preach the Gospel of Christ, he noted that one of the greatest hindrances was the Japanese concern for the fate of their non-Christian relatives. "Will our ancestors be pleased if we receive Baptism and become Christians?" they asked Xavier.

Enter the Parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus, revealed only in the Gospel according to Saint Luke (16:19-31). For the last few weeks, we have heard Jesus' clear warnings about the dangers of earthly possessions. This story functions as the summary to Luke's presentation on this topic. The parable centers on the pitiful character of Lazarus. He is so helpless and weak he longs merely for the scraps of food that fall from the rich man's table. It is to helpless beggars such as Lazarus that God comes and saves. It is to helpless beggars who put their trust in God's abundant mercy that Christ comes and redeems.

Even in the torment of eternal suffering, the rich man continues his obsession with self. The "Great Reversal" – a major theme in the Gospel according to Saint Luke – is again revealed this morning. Trust in worldly riches that blessed the rich man now condemns him, while trusting in the riches of heaven that seems to condemn Lazarus during his earthly life finally is revealed as the greatest treasure.

The last writing of Martin Luther before his death in 1546 was short and simple, but summarized Luther's whole approach to Christian faith and life: "We are beggars. This is true." May Christ preserve us also from the dangers and snare of the world's riches, that we may be carried by the angels into the presence of the prophets, the apostles, and our Lord Himself.







1 Timothy 6:6-19

Now there is great gain in godliness with contentment, for we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world. But if we have food and clothing, with these we will be content. But those who desire to be rich fall into temptation, into a snare, into many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evils. It is through this craving that some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pangs.

But as for you, O man of God, flee these things. Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.


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I charge you in the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, to keep the commandment unstained and free from reproach until the appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will display at the proper time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone has immortality, who dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see. Luke 16:19-31

[Jesus said:] "There was a rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate was laid a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table. Moreover, even the dogs came and licked his sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried, and in Hades, being in torment, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side.

And he called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the end of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in anguish in this flame.'

But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that you in your lifetime received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner bad things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish. And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, in order that those who would pass from here to you may not be able, and none may cross from there to us.' And he said, 'Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house— for I have five brothers—so that he may warn them, lest they also come into this place of torment.' But Abraham said, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them.' And he said, 'No, father Abraham, but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' He said to him, 'If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead.""



In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this altar in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine, but His very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust in His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes.

Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor of this congregation. For further study, see Matthew 5:23ff, 10:32ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-29; 1 Corinthians 11:17-34.

What actually is the Lord's Supper?

The Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) should be received, after proper instruction and preparation, in the sure and certain confidence that Jesus Christ is truly present in, with and under the bread and wine to forgive the sin of all who receive him in repentance (according to 1Corinthians 10:14-17; 11: 17-33; Matthew 26:17-30; Mark 14:12-26; Luke 22:7-30). Please review the questions on pages 326-27 and 329-330 in the front part of "Lutheran Service Book" for a proper understanding of this holy meal.



	believe in the words of Jesus himself when he declares that his Body and Blood are truly present
	in, with and under the bread and wine, offering life, salvation and the forgiveness of sins;
	sincerely intend to live a God-pleasing life in accordance with God's will as revealed in the Bible;
	have received instruction about the Supper at a Lutheran Church Missouri Synod congregation.



SPOTLIGHT ON STEWARDSHIP Amos 6:1a "Woe to those who are at ease in Zion." The Book of Amos is a warning to God's people who have been given great material wealth. As Jesus Himself mentions, material blessings can turn into temptations — chiefly the temptation to think of ourselves as self-sufficient and independent. What does Amos suggest as a way to combat this temptation? First, faith in the Lord and dependence upon Him! And if our faith is right, we will want to follow the rest of Amos' instructions — to bless the poor with our alms and to make sure the Lord's House is properly cared for. In other words, we are called to align our actions with God's priorities and put others ahead of ourselves.

SEPTEMBER HYMN OF THE MONTH

FIGHT THE GOOD FIGHT LSB 664 John Samuel Bewley Monsell (1811-75) was a prolific writer of poetry, prose and hymnody, yet only a handful of his approximately three hundred hymns are considered to have enduring quality. Two are found in *LSB* (this one and "Sing to the Lord of harvest," *LSB* 893).

The four stanzas in *LSB* have been altered little from the original and largely for modernization of language. The hymn is properly located under the theme "The Church Militant"; though far from a triumphalistic call to arms, it is instead a call to remain in God-given faith, under the cross, during the daily assaults of temptation.

1 Timothy 6:12 serves as the basis for the first stanza, as St. Paul exhorts Timothy to "fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses." The preceding verses inform us that the battle is the daily struggle against temptation. Like Timothy, Christians have been called to new life in Christ; the victory over sin and death is the one He won on the cross (1 Corinthians 15:57) and gives to us in His Gospel. In the second line, Monsell makes clear that our might is the Lord's: "Christ is your strength, and Christ your right." "Right" should not be understood in the popular notion of "that which everyone naturally deserves." Rather, this "right" has the sense of the righteousness we possess because we are justified for Jesus' sake. To "lay hold on life" is a reference to faith that clings to Christ.

Stanza 2 is built on Hebrews 12:1-2: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfector of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." Theses verses summarize the Christian's life and fight well: Jesus has already endured the cross for us. Now, as His forgiven people, we run our race. How? By repentance and laying aside the sin that clings so closely. As Monsell puts in, we run "through God's good grace." Alive in Christ, we continue toward our heavenly home.

Stanza 3 is rooted in 1 Peter 5:6-7: "Humble yourselves, therefore, under the mighty hand of God so that at the proper time He may exalt you, casting all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you." The chapter warns against both pride, which leads one to see no need for God's help, and worry, which tempts one to question it. Shortly thereafter, it warns that the devil prowls about like a lion, seeking someone to devour. Monsell thus bids the people of God to cast their cares upon the Lord, whose mercy is boundless: and while faith trusts in Christ's gifts of life and love now, it will be proved in the end.

Thus we have stanza 4, with its reference to Colossians 3:11: "Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free, but Christ is all, and in all." In the surrounding verses, St Paul reminds Christians that they have died to sin and now live in Christ. Thus they are to resist temptation, repent of their sin, and rejoice that their salvation is found in Jesus. For those weary of the grinding temptations, the final verse is of great comfort: the Lord is near, He will not fail, and He remains the Christian's help and life for eternity.
